21	involving personnel trained in the rescue, stabilization,
22	transportation, and treatment of sick or injured persons.
23	"(8) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL (EMSP).
24	The collective term used to refer to licensed Emergency
25	Medical Technicians, Emergency Medical Technicians
26	Intermediate, Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians,
27	Paramedics, and/or any level of licensure as recognized by the
28	National Highway Traffic Administration for individuals who

1	provide emergency medical services or who initiate immediate

17	"(16) PROVIDER SERVICE. An organization, whether

20	"(2) AMBULANCE SERVICE OPERATOR. Any person, firm or
21	corporation engaged in the business of operating a ground
22	ambulance or convalescent ambulance.
23	"(3) LICENSED AMBULANCE DRIVER. Any individual who
24	successfully completes the course of instruction for emergency
25	vehicle operation prescribed by the Board of Health, and who
26	has been granted a current, valid license by the Board of
27	Health.
28	"(17) SCENE FLIGHT. The flight of an air ambulance
29	to the physical location of a sick or injured person.

1 "(11) CONVALESCENT AMBULANCE. A vehicle that is 2 intended to be used for and is maintained or operated for 3 making non emergency calls for patients in a recumbent 4 position who require transportation to or from a physician's 5 office, hospital, other health care facility, or residence, 6 provided a convalescent ambulance shall not include a hospital 7 operated vehicle used exclusively for intra hospital facility 8 transfers. 9 "(18) TRANSPORT VEHICLE. An air or ground ambulance. 10 "\$22-18-2. 11 "The provisions of this article shall not apply to 12 volunteer rescue squads that are members of the Alabama 13 Association of Rescue Squads, Inc. and which furnish BLS 14 ambulance service to the public; nor shall the provisions of 15 this chapter apply to businesses or companies which only 16 provide free ambulance service to their employees who require 17 medical attention on business or company grounds; nor shall 18 the provisions of this chapter apply to or govern ambulances 19 owned by the a county, a municipality or any other political 20 subdivision of the state., nor to the drivers of or attendants 21 on such ambulances in Marengo County. - "(8) Has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, or a crime in which the victim is an EMS EMSP

  provider organization service or an EMS patient, unless the board determines that the fact of the conviction would not be likely to interfere with the performance of EMS duties.
  - "(9) Has performed any act requiring licensure or certification under state EMS statutes, without possession of the requisite licensure or certification.
- "(10) Has performed any act which exceeds the scope
  of license or privilege granted to the holder.

"In those instances in which an ambulance service operator, ambulance driver, ambulance attendant, ambulance driver attendant, or emergency medical technician EMSP of any municipality, county, fire district, or the state is are employed by the State of Alabama, any county, fire district, or another municipality, within 24 months after completing the training requirements mandated by this chapter, or by rules adopted by the Alabama Committee on Public Health board, the total expense of the training, including, but not limited to, salary paid during training, transportation costs paid to the trainee for travel to and from the training facility, room, board, tuition, evertime paid to other employees who fill in for the trainee during his or her absence, and any other related training expenses, shall be reimbursed to the municipality, county, fire district, or the state which paid

1 for the training. The municipality, county, fire district, or 2 the state which paid for the training shall submit an itemized 3 sworn statement to the new employer of the ambulance service 4 operator, ambulance driver, ambulance attendant, ambulance 5 driver-attendant, or emergency medical technician, as the case 6 may be, shall demand payment thereof, and may enforce 7 collection of the obligation through civil remedies and 8 procedures. The terms "ambulance service operator," "ambulance 9 driver, " "ambulance attendant, " "ambulance driver attendant, " 10 and "emergency medical technician," "EMSP" shall have the same 11 meanings meaning as in Section 22-18-1." 12 Section 2. Sections 22-18-40, 22-18-41, and 22-18-42, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 13 14 "§22-18-40. 15 "(a) The board shall be assisted in formulating rules and policy pertaining to emergency medical services by 16 17 the State Emergency Medical Control Committee (SEMCC). Members 18 of the SEMCC shall serve without compensation but shall be 19 entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in the 20 performance of the duties of their office at the same rate 21 paid state employees. The chair of SEMCC may establish 22 subcommittees of SEMCC comprised of representatives from 23 ambulance, fire, rescue, and other EMS groups, as needed. 24 "(b) The SEMCC shall be composed as follows: 25 "(1) The medical directors of each regional EMS 26 agency region designated by the board as ex officio members

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with voting privileges.

1	"(2) One member who shall be appointed by the
2	Alabama Chapter of the American College of Emergency
3	Physicians.
4	"(3) One member who shall be appointed by the State

1 "(f) The SEMCC may meet and vote by electronic means 2 and votes may be taken by proxy. Those members participating 3 by electronic means shall be counted toward a quorum. A quorum 4 is established by attending in person or by electronic means. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the membership. 5 6 "(g) The membership of the SEMCC shall be inclusive 7 and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and 8 economic diversity of the state. 9 "\$22-18-41. 10 "(a) The board may by rule designate certain procedures as "advanced life support techniques," which may be 11 12 performed by EMTs EMSP during emergencies, such as situations where the life, health, or safety of a prehospital patient is 13 14 in immediate jeopardy. The board may prescribe by rule the 15 qualifications and certification necessary for personnel 16 performing advanced life support techniques, and the specific 17 conditions under which the techniques may be performed by emergency medical technicians EMSP. Notwithstanding any 18 19 statutory provision to the contrary, emergency medical 20 services personnel EMSP who possess the necessary 21 qualifications and certification prescribed by the board shall 22 not be deemed to have engaged in the unlawful practice of 23 medicine when performing advanced life support techniques in 24 accordance with the constraints established by the board. 25 "(b) Emergency vehicles manned by licensed emergency 26 medical technicians who are trained to provide advanced life 27 support and who possess current board licensure, may carry a

drug kit containing limited quantities of drugs, including controlled substances, which have been approved by the board

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for administration to patients during the regular course of duties of prehospital personnel, provided, that these drugs may be administered only pursuant to the order of a physician who possesses a valid license to practice medicine within this state, and who is, at the time the order is given, functioning in accordance with the applicable regional medical control plan approved by the board. Fluids and drugs may not be carried only by any ambulance a properly licensed provider service operator or other emergency medical services provider without a certificate of fluid and drug authorization from the board. The board may offer a certificate of fluid and drug authorization to a non transport service which is not licensed if the unlicensed non transport service meets all requirements in the board's rules for issuance of a certificate to a licensed ambulance operator. A licensed emergency medical services provider service may purchase necessary drugs and fluids <del>pursuant to proper authorization</del> from any reliable source, including wholesalers, distributors, and hospitals. Emergency medical services providers Provider services shall purchase, maintain, and administer fluids and drugs in accordance with regulations promulgated by the board. "(c) Emergency medical technicians EMSP may not perform services only pursuant to standing orders from physicians without prior approval of the board the protocols approved by the board. Emergency medical technicians EMSP may accept orders to perform advanced life support techniques only from medical control direction physicians who have completed

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medical control direction training prescribed by the board on

1 the recommendation of the SEMCC and the State Health Officer 2 and holds a current medical direction number. 3 "\$22-18-42. 4 "This chapter shall govern and it shall authorize the Board of Health to regulate only emergency medical care 5 6 provided outside of hospitals, emergency medical technicians 7 EMSP who provide care outside of hospitals, ambulance drivers, 8 ambulance service operators, provider services ground 9 ambulances, convalescent air ambulances, ALS non-transport 10 services, the training of ambulance drivers and emergency medical technicians EMSP who provide care outside of 11 12 hospitals, and orders given for emergency medical care to be provided outside of hospitals. Notwithstanding any provision 13 14 of law to the contrary, authorized drugs and fluids for 15 emergency medical care and services may be purchased from any reliable source, including wholesalers, distributors, and 16 17 hospitals. To the extent medical care and nursing care provided within hospitals is governed by other provisions of 18 19 law, these those provisions of law shall not be construed to 20 have been repealed, amended, abridged, or otherwise altered by 21 this chapter." 22 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and 23 24 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
